

### Purpose

- To analyze access of health care for New Brunswick residents
- Reviewing survey responses and seeing which areas can be of improvement

### Significance

- 54 percent of New Brunswick residents have difficulty in accessing health care
- Disparities in health care access can lead to unwanted health consequences and setbacks
- Improvements can be made in order to decrease disparities

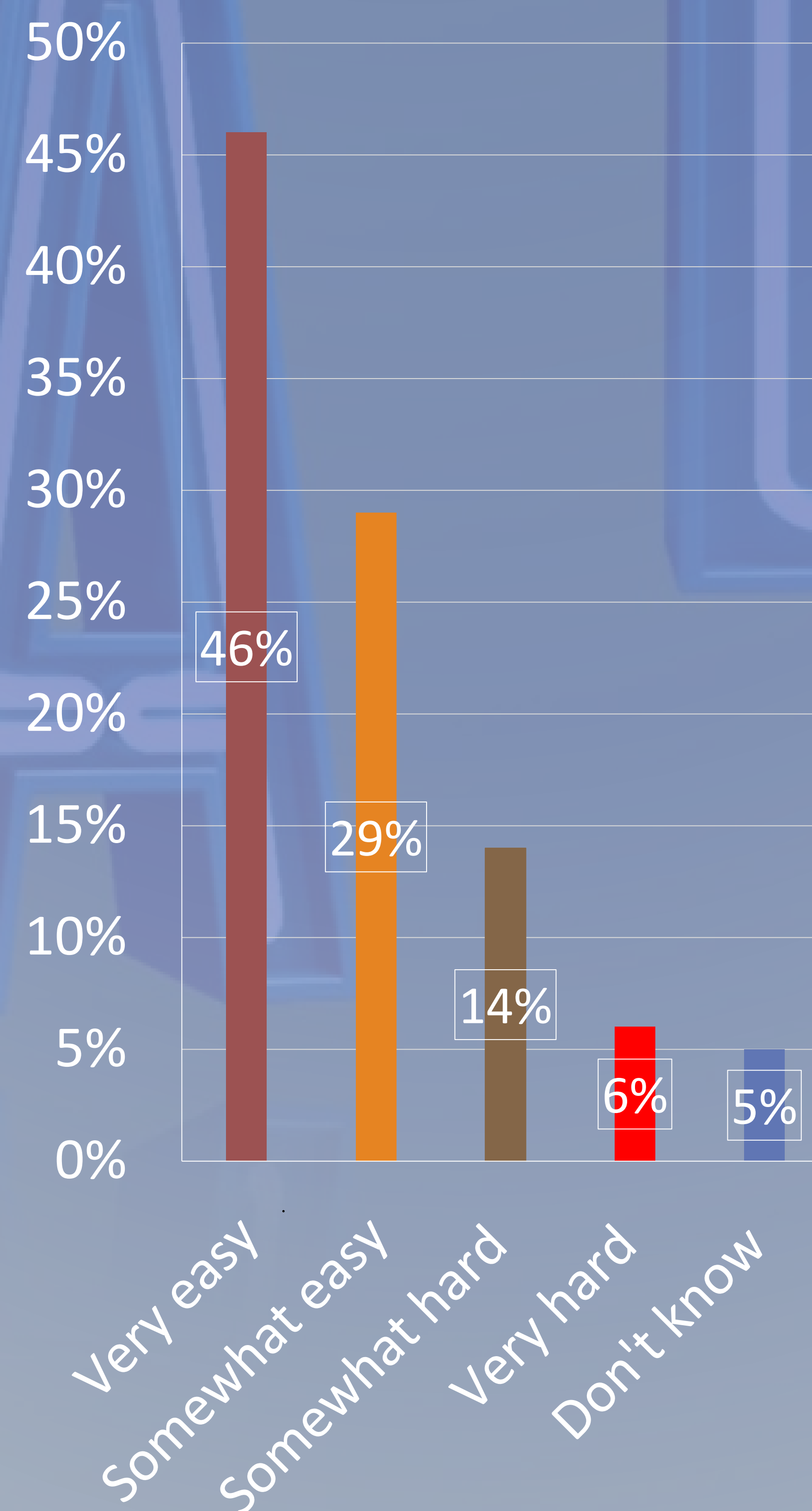
### Methodology

- Survey administered through landlines and cell phones with n=1000
- Current survey now administered by addressed based probability sample
- Survey was administered every 2 years and recently changed to every 4 years
- Administer surveys in order to analyze trend

### Outcomes

- Alcohol /drug use questions
- Focus on more health questions
- Addition or omitting certain questions for the 2016 survey

### Evaluation

- The survey date will be compared to previous data in this longitudinal survey
- Creation of a trend will indicate the increase or decrease in provided health services
- Conducting a literature review to see which questions to add or discard
- Using SPSS to analyze past and current data
- From this, the 2016 survey will be fielded with the necessary changes

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
