I would probably move the course to Canvas rather than Sakai. In my opinion, navigating the modules was a bit more difficult on Sakai.
I would make sure that the TA's are on the same page. I feel like theres been multiple times where one TA told me to do something one way and the other TA told me the opposite. It gets kind of confusing and of course I would like to do it the way the person who is grading my paper wants it but sometimes they both grade it.
The ONLY issue I had with this course was the way it was structured.
